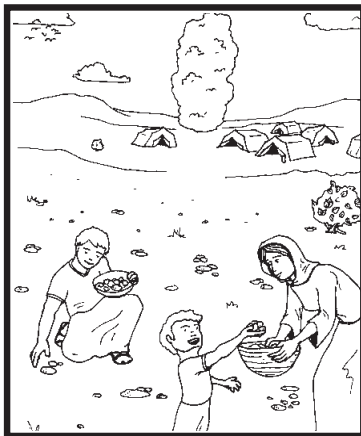

Grumbling in the Desert

After the Israelites left the Desert of Sin, they went to Rephidim. There was no water there, so the people grumbled again to Moses.

They said, "Why did you bring us out of Egypt? Do you want to kill us?"

Again, God was patient. He told Moses to strike a rock in front of Mount Sinai with his walking stick. Moses struck the rock, and water came out of it.

After the Israelites left Egypt, they traveled through the Desert of Sin. Because they were hungry, they grumbled to Moses.

They said, "Why did you bring us out in the desert to die? It would have been better to stay in Egypt. There we had food."

God was patient with the grumbling Hebrews. The next day He sent quail and manna. The manna was like a sweet wafer, and it covered the ground each morning.

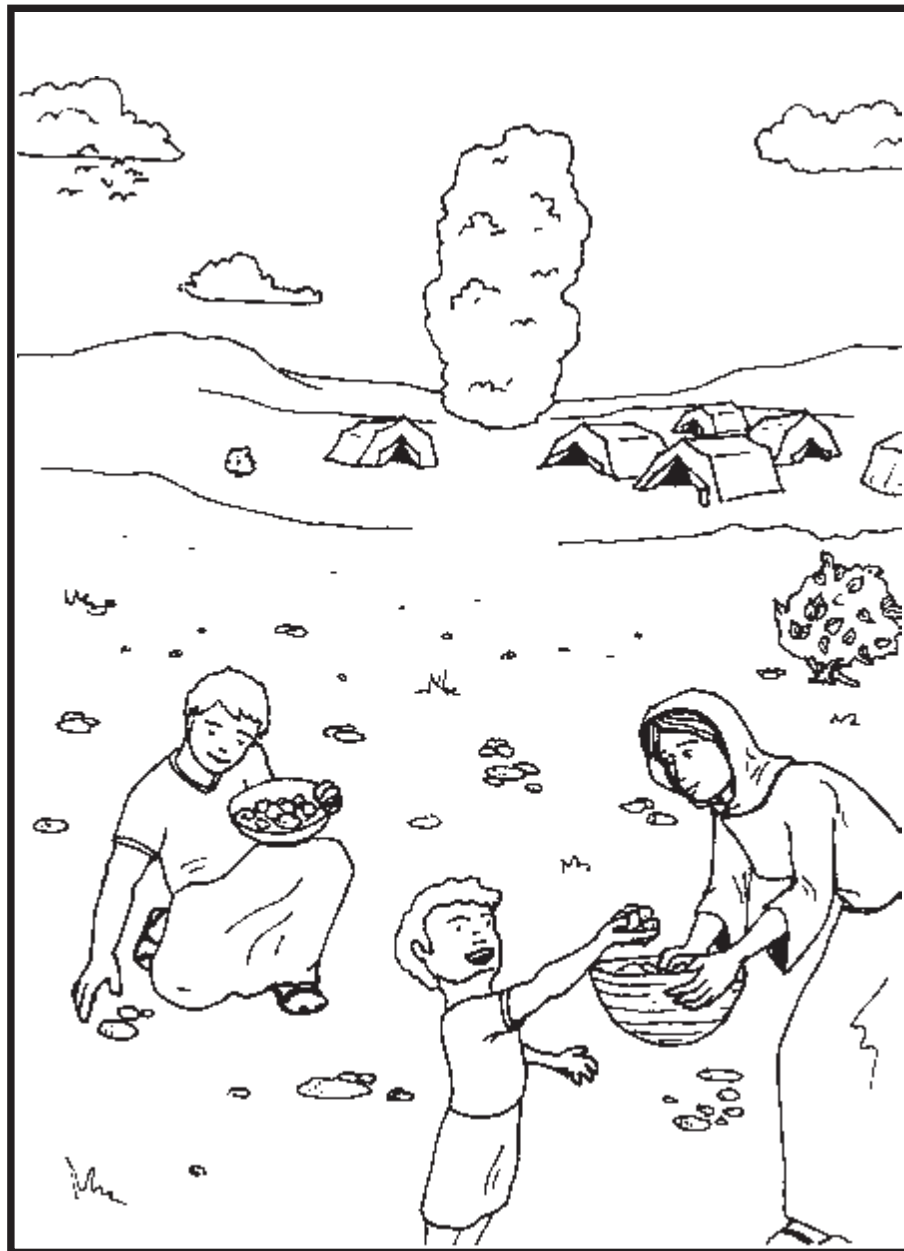

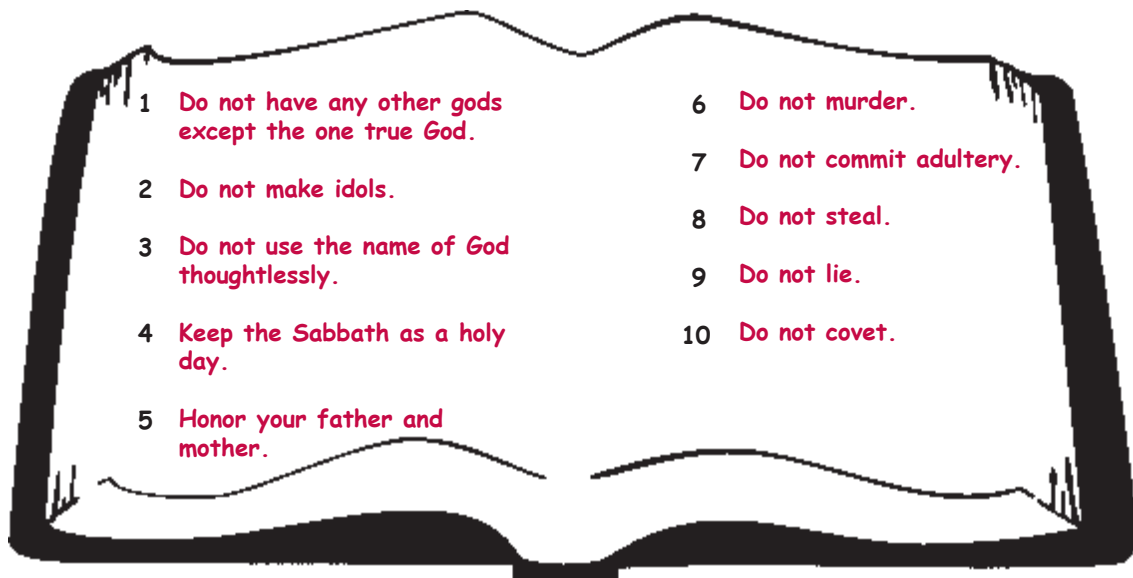

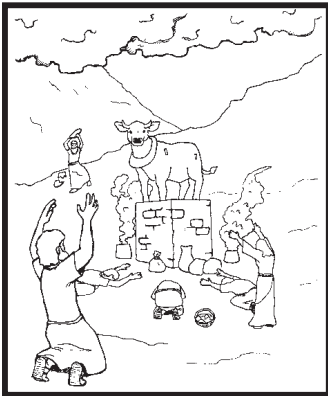

Moses was very angry with the Hebrews for making an idol and worshipping it. He threw down the tablets of stone with the Ten Commandments and broke them.

God told Moses to come back up on the mountain. Then He rewrote the commandments for Moses.

Moses was on Mount Sinai for 40 days and nights. The Israelites decided he was not going to come back. They told Moses' brother Aaron to make them a god they could worship.

Aaron made a golden idol that looked like a calf. He made it from the gold jewelry the people were wearing. Then the Hebrews worshipped the calf.

They broke God's commandments they had promised to keep.

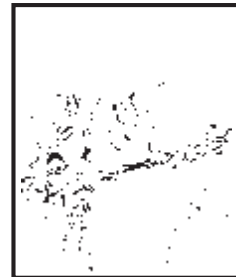
Grumbling, Commandments, and Rebellion

When Moses came down from the mountain, he saw the Hebrews worshipping the golden calf. He was so angry he threw down the tablets of stone and broke them. Then God told Moses to come back up on the mountain. He wrote the commandments again on new tablets of stone.

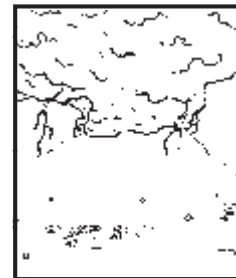

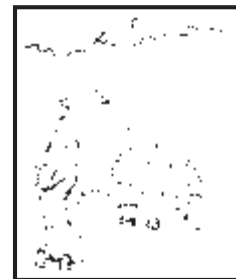
After the Hebrews left Egypt they traveled in the desert. Because they did not have enough food and water, they grumbled. God was patient with them. He gave them quail and manna to eat. He also gave them water to drink from a rock near Mount Sinai.



God told Moses to come up to Mount Sinai. There, He wrote the Ten Commandments, which told the Israelites how to love God and each other.



While Moses was on Mount Sinai for 40 days, the Hebrews wanted another god to worship. They told Aaron to make them an idol. Aaron made a calf out of gold. He made the calf from the jewelry the people were wearing.

Grumbling, Commandments, and Rebellion

After the Hebrews left Egypt, they grumbled about life in the desert. They complained about food and water. They did not trust God to provide everything they needed.

God spoke and gave the Hebrews the Ten Commandments. These commandments were true and good for the people. They were true because God is truth and speaks only truth.

3

The first four commandments told the Hebrews how to love the only true and almighty God. They also tell us how to show our love to God.

The Hebrews disobeyed God and worshipped the idol of a golden calf. Their sin separated them from God. God punished them because they disobeyed His laws.

Joshua led the Israelites to the edge of Jordan River. They camped there before crossing it. The next day God told the priests to carry the Ark of the Covenant into the river.

The priests obeyed God. When they stepped into the Jordan River, it stopped flowing. Then the Israelites crossed the river on dry ground.

Entering the Promised Land--At Last

God gave the Israelites a special plan for conquering Jericho. They had to trust God and follow the plan exactly. They had to depend on God to help them conquer Jericho and the land of Canaan.

God performed many miracles so that the Israelites could conquer Jericho and Canaan. He was able to perform these miracles because He is omnipotent.

3

God kept His promise to Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob. He led the Israelites into Canaan and helped them conquer it. God always keeps his promises because He is truth.

4

God chose Joshua to be the leader and servant of the Israelites. Joshua served the people by trusting and obeying God. He led them into Canaan as God's faithful servant.

5

God saved Rahab and her family when Jericho was conquered because they believed in the God of the Israelites.

We are saved from the punishment we deserve for our sins when we believe in Jesus as God's Son and our Savior.
