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COURSE DESCRIPTION: This course is a survey of six contemporary philosophical worldviews (Christianity, Islam, Marxism, Humanism, New Age, and Postmodernism) in the following areas: theology, philosophy, ethics, science, psychology, sociology, political science, economics, law, and history.

COURSE OBJECTIVES: After completing this course, students should be able to:

1. **Articulate** a factual foundation for their chosen worldview
2. **Develop** basic skills of disciplined worldview inquiry
3. **Understand** the similarities and differences between the following worldviews: Christianity, Islam, Secular Humanism, Marxism-Leninism, Cosmic Humanism, and Postmodernism.
4. **Apply** an understanding of worldviews in the areas of the natural sciences, the social sciences, the humanities, and biblical studies

COURSE REQUIREMENTS:

1. **Attendance:** Attendance at all class periods is required. Unexcused absences or tardies will result in a lower final grade.
2. **Class Notes:** Take notes on all lectures. Notes should be clear, concise, and well organized.
3. **Textbook reading assignments:** Each unit has corresponding textbook reading assignments. These assignments are found within the book *Understanding the Times*.
4. **Essay reading assignments:** Each unit has corresponding essay reading assignments.
5. **Video outlines:** Each unit has corresponding video presentations and outlines. Videos may be divided into multiple parts and average 20 to 40 minutes in length. Each presentation has a set of video outlines with fill-in-the-blank notes.
6. **Discussion:** Participate in all classroom discussions.
7. **Unit Essays (10):** Each unit (except Psychology and the Conclusion) has corresponding essay assignments. These essays will be 1–2 page written responses to problems addressed in letters from Doug, a friend who has just begun college.
8. **Worldview Analysis Paper (1):** At the end of unit five (Psychology) there will be a 4–6 page paper defining and comparing the Christian, Islamic, Secular Humanist, Marxist, New Age, and Postmodernist worldviews.
9. **Unit Exams (10):** On the last day of the each unit, you must pass an exam covering material given during the lectures.
10. **Comprehensive Exam (1):** At the end of the Conclusion, there will be a comprehensive 150 question multiple-choice exam covering all the materials from the course. *Questions for the comprehensive exam are found in the video, textbook, and essay discussion questions as well as the Fact Sheets.*
